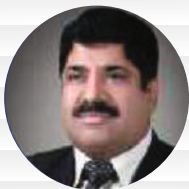

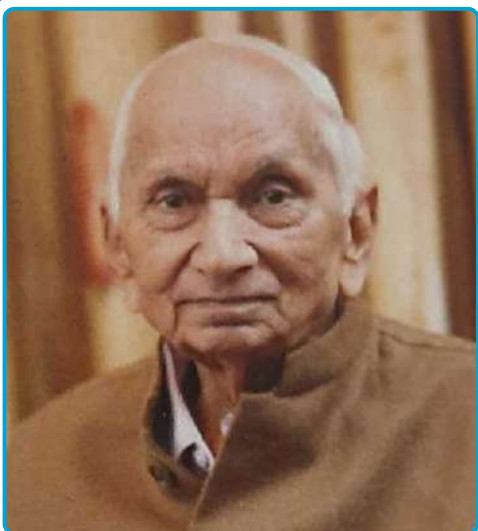

- Because our entire focus is to revive the groundwater table and the overall water ecosystem which is necessary for a healthy life.
- Because we are determined to provide safe and healthy drinkable water to every household in India.

With this vision in mind, we are pleased to introduce “Mission Jaldhara” with you.

Why Mission Jaldhara?

According to reports, the over exploited areas were concentrated in Tamil Nadu, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Telangana, Punjab and Haryana. To quantify the facts, there has been an 82% decline in the ground watertable in Distt. Gurugram between 2018 – 2020 and it has further declined by over 50 percent in 2022.

The groundwater table in these parts of the country is rapidly going into the dark zone. This level is dangerously low and requires immediate action.

How do we plan to achieve a sustainable water ecosystem?

Our dream is big. Our vision is to make India a drought free, hydro – ecologically balanced and environmentally sustainable Nation.

And we have just begun..

Our campaign is starting in Gurugram and will spread across states in India.

Our panel of experts have designed the following plan of action for achieving this dream:

- 1. Revival of dry & dysfunctional rainwater harvesting wells across District Gurugram.** Different stakeholders constructed these wells in the pre-covid era to jumpstart rainwater harvesting initiative. The project however was put on halt due to corona crisis due to which most of the wells became dysfunctional. With our intervention, these wells shall be revived to their optimum functional levels, and will be maintained by our team of contractors.
- 2. Revival of rural water ecosystem bodies in and around District Gurugram.** The falling groundwater level affects the agricultural economy and day-to-day life of people residing in these villages.
- 3. Judicious use of water resources.** This is possible through mass awareness of the current situation arising through India and how every individual can contribute through lifestyle changes.

Why is it close to us ?

“We do not inherit the earth from our ancestors. We borrow it from our children.”

We want to leave a clean, sustainable environment for our future generations. The world is moving towards cleaner, greener fuels. There is marked awareness about leaving smaller carbon footprint. 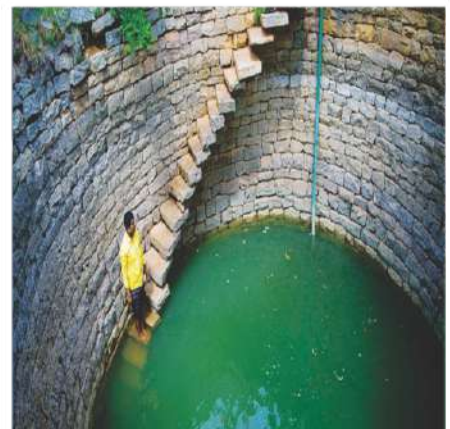

Financial Stability and Development Council (FSDC) on Thursday underscored a need to assess financial sector risks and the financial market conditions regularly by the government and the regulators so that any vulnerability can be mitigated and addressed without delay.



Indian fintech market has received \$29 billion in funding across 2,084 deals to date (January 2017-July 2022), gaining 14 per cent share of the global funding and No 2 spot on the deal volume, a new report has said.



The [Adani Group](#) on Friday completed the acquisition of [Ambuja Cements](#) and its subsidiary [ACC Ltd](#) from Switzerland's [Holcim](#) Group for \$6.4 billion. The two cement makers together make Adani the second largest cement player in the Indian market only behind Aditya Birla Group's [UltraTech Cement](#).



The Samvardhana Motherson International Limited (SAMIL) on Thursday signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Ministry of Investment, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (MISA), stated a press release. The partnership aims to identify investment development opportunities for industrial and service activities in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA).



Gandhinagar: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday laid the foundation stones for Suzuki Motor Corporation's upcoming electric cell plant in Gujarat and a new vehicle manufacturing plant in Haryana. The two projects will entail an investment of over Rs 30,000 crore



India's food secretary today affirmed the declining rice output trend in the country that had pushed New Delhi to put restrictions on the export of the food grain even at the cost of likely stoking food inflation across several nations.



India's food production industry is worth over \$400 billion, the primary source of livelihood for over nearly half of the country's population but the level of food processing across categories is significantly low, said a recent study.

The National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) Chairman Meenesh Shah said the milk producer companies procured milk worth Rs 5,575 crore last fiscal year and the same is set to triple and reach over Rs 18,000 crore in the next five years.



Diageo India, the country's biggest spirits firm, said it has invested Rs 45 crore for its craft and innovation hub in Goa, part of its strategy to accelerate innovation and strengthen its craft and premium portfolio.



Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann has approved the draft Industrial and Business Development policy, which aims to attract Rs 5 lakh crore investment in five years. Mann approved the draft policy on Saturday, an official statement said on Sunday.

The Reserve Bank of India released the monthly data on India's international trade in services for July 2022 today. According to the data, India's services exports went up by 20.2 per cent on an annual basis to \$23.26 billion in July 2022.



Shares of Adobe plunged nearly 17% after the Photoshop maker announced a \$20 billion cash and stock deal to buy online design startup Figma on Thursday. The biggest plunge in the company's stock since 2010 wiped out more than \$30 billion from Adobe's market value. The deal has sparked some concerns among investors who argued that Adobe overpaid for Figma.



Commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal has launched an initiative -- SETU (Supporting Entrepreneurs in Transformation and Upskilling) -- here to connect startups in India to US-based investors. SETU is designed to break the geographical barriers between US mentors willing to invest in entrepreneurship and sunrise startups in India.



Addressing the nation in the 92nd edition of 'Mann ki Baat', Prime Minister Narendra Modi said the spread of internet facilities to villages through Digital India has boosted digital entrepreneurs.

“Digital India has taken facilities earlier available in big cities to remote villages, boosting the number of digital entrepreneurs,” he said.



Researchers at IIT Guwahati have developed a non-toxic and edible coating to extend the shelf life of fruits and vegetables. The coating was made using a mixture of micro-algae extract and polysaccharides. "It can help preserve vegetables and fruits for as long as two months," a researcher said. The coating has been tested on potatoes, tomatoes, strawberries, apples, pineapples etc.



Speaking in the US, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said that Indian startups need more opportunities so that their ideas can reach out to the global market and stated that "Silicon Valley is the best place for an idea to go global". He added that the government is playing the role of facilitator between Indian startups and US-based investors.

Vedanta's billionaire Chairman Anil Agarwal said that once the glass and semiconductor chip is available in India, a ₹1 lakh laptop can cost ₹40,000 or less. His statement comes after Vedanta announced its new semiconductor plant with Foxconn will be set up in Gujarat. "We'll not be manufacturing laptops, mobile phones...but we'll create a cluster to encourage manufacturers," said Agarwal.

Needo-education in India : Innovative Solutions for Quality, Affordability and Accessibility

For needo-education in India, we have to treat the national education policy (NEP 2020) as an invention from the collective wisdom of the wise Indians and work without worries on it as an innovation which means the application of invention by accepting the challenges of all kinds. Innovative solutions are required for ensuring quality, affordability and accessibility of needo-education with skills for the manpower required by the employers in various sectors of the economy including industry.

Being a needonomist and a teacher from a family of teachers for four-generation, I believe that there is a trade-off between quality and quantity. For needo-quality, we have to sacrifice quantity. For ensuring quantity we have to sacrifice quality. But there are compulsions of a democratic India to enhance gross enrolment ratio as well as ensure the quality which is a challenge in the implementation of NEP 2020.

Without mincing words, I believe that many of us are careless and useless to be employed by the employers in private as well as the public sector. The real challenge is how to convert careless into careful and useless into useful human resources needed by employers in the present job market.

I believe investment in education is the biggest one giving lifetime returns in terms of employment and entrepreneurship. We have vast claims of doing great things for our young generation through NEP 2020 developed in 66 pages in 27 headings necessary but not sufficient for global knowledge economy and achieving sustainable development goals (SDGs) 2030 and not in tune with national youth policy (NYP) 2014.

For needo-education, it is necessary to understand India

as Bharat made of two words 'Bha' –meaning knowledge and 'Rata' meaning devoted as a knowledge seeker. Bharat deserves to be known as a knowledge economy where 'Sarswati' is equally if not more than 'Lakshmi' is worshipped. Bharat is the only country called India in English dictionaries as an independent nation declared in August. We need to understand, analyse, interpret and adopt INDIA as an independent, non-violent, democracy with integrity and amity.

I have no hesitation in saying that the makeup of dishonesty is corruption and we have to pay its price in terms of inefficiencies visible around with discrimination and discontent in democratic Bharat. To implement NEP 2020, the greatest limitation of overpopulation in our beloved Bharat to be made Swarnim in 2047.

There is a strong case for searching the innovative solutions for quality, affordability and accessibility of needoeducation at all levels to make the manpower suitable for the employers in India and outside in foreign land.

For efficiency, sufficiency and equity in the system of higher education, we must link fee structure and user charges with inflation rate based on retail prices so that high-cost recovery be ensured smoothly.

To compete with foreign universities, we need to accept the challenge with the spiritual training of teachers. To reduce the delay in decision-making, let us learn from Palli -Palli (jaldi-jaldi in Hindi) culture of South Korea with whom we share Independence Day.

For adopting the blended mode of education, we have to develop soft skills as information technology software which is equally if not more important than the hardware.

To improve the teaching and learning outcomes in the institutions, we need to recruit the best teachers with qualities of head and heart, human values and ethics flowing from the epics including Gita, Anu-Gita and Ramayana.

We are required to promote yog as summation in terms

of spiritual mathematics $1 (\text{soul}) + 1 (\text{GOD}) = 1$ with a smile of anticipation for a bright future more than celebrating International Yoga Day on June 21 every year as a ritual. One in all and all in one must to be understood by all of us. The spiritual, humanitarian existence of a human being is capable of removing all kinds of inequalities (gender disparities) which is a social reality existing in India.

I believe that the maximum job opportunities are available in marketing as the market is full of goods and the real challenge is to sell these products. This calls for communication skills without which one cannot survive, exist and excels in the needo-marketing of any product or service.

To solve the dichotomy between quality education and affordability & accessibility in Indian institutions, we require the NAW (need, affordability and worth) approach of marketing the educational product firstly creating the need for the educational product, then making it affordable and price it worth of it under public-private partnership model along with communication skills necessary for employability and entrepreneurship. I would like to point out that an educational product would be popular only if it satisfies the essential need of the students, provide employment opportunities and is utilitarian.

To ensure quality research, we have to encourage the scholars to analyse before covid (BC) and after covid (AC) for drawing the policy implications

For Needo-employability and Needo-entrepreneurship, we need to become street SMART (simple, moral, action-oriented, responsive and transparent). This calls for simple living and no thinking. No thinking does not mean that we should not think. But think of actions and not results as authenticated in Gita. To adopt a practical approach to human resource development (HRD) in the Indian education system, it is essential to understand the SIMPLE model of HRD consisting of six human development activities such as spiritual quotient (SQ) development, intuition development, mental level development, physical development, love oneself attitude development and emotional quotient (EQ) development. The synergy of these six aspects of HRD is an essential requirement of the desirable professionals for the Indian economy to emerge and realize its full potential in Swarnim Bharat towards 2047.

Needoeducation calls for needo-visits of museums

(Krishna Museum and Dharohar Haryana Cultural Museum in Kurukshetra) as mandatory for every student once a year on a ticket which will boost the knowledge economy of India in all dimensions with creativity, innovation and critical thinking desired under Higher Order Thinking Skills (HOTS) of NEP 2020 necessary to ensure needo-employment and needo-entrepreneurship.

We have to think inside the box and work together with one voice of commitment. We can think out of the box too for making NEP a success story and avoid a post-mortem approach. We must promote core values including professionalism, integrity and respect for diversity among all the stakeholders of needoeducation.

For needo-employability and Needo-entrepreneurship under the Skill India programme, we require life skills, reading skills, writing skills, marketing skills, business skills, analysing skills for artificial intelligence (AI) and above all verbal communication skills. For a prosperous and progressive future of Indian youth, we need the power of skills for individuals and communities in 28 States and 9 UTs of India. We have to utilize the allocated resources for 'Skill India' properly, productively and practically (3P) for using the hands, heads and hearts (3H) of the Indian youth in post covid era. The efforts of skill development under 'Skill India' as a development strategy for 'Make in India' are necessary but not sufficient. To make them sufficient and sustainable, we need to increase the return on training investment (ROTI) which calls for communication skills with spiritual input and time management. There is an urgent need of training of trainers with a chain of reforms ensuring fundamental changes with greater accountability, transparency and morality (ATM) more important than the ATM of any bank. We need to make the labour market system dynamic to get the demand and supply of skills on a real-time basis for meeting the total domestic requirement of trained manpower. We have to develop a labour market information system by modernization of all the employment exchanges in public-private-partnership (PPP) mode and develop a national web portal. Abilities of head and heart, skills and knowledge (ASK) are the engines of economic growth and human resource development (HRD).

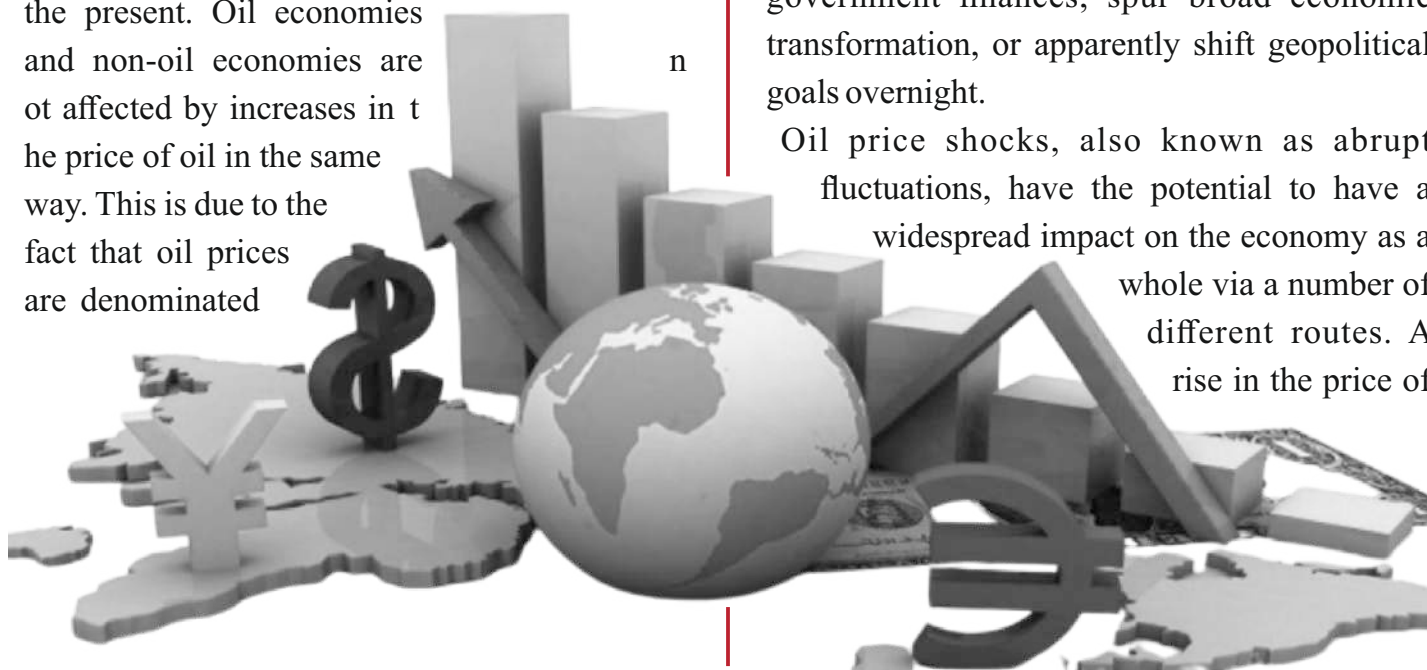

Oil price fluctuations and their effect on the economy are a well-established connection, according to widespread consensus. As a consequence of differences in oil prices among nations, it has been hypothesized that a great deal of macroeconomic aggregates is susceptible to instability. As a consequence of the importance of this factor, it has been said that the price of oil is more unpredictable and unexpected. The price of crude oil has seen significant swings over the last three decades and has become far more unpredictable than it was during the time period spanning World War II and the present. Oil economies and non-oil economies are not affected by increases in the price of oil in the same way. This is due to the fact that oil prices are denominated

in US dollars, and as a result, their fluctuations in domestic currencies depend closely on the exchange rates between dollars and other currencies.

Changes in the price of crude oil have huge repercussions for both the expansion of economies and the standard of living in different parts of the globe. Crude oil is undoubtedly one of the single most important driving factors of the global economy. Large, sudden shifts in the price of oil may have outsized consequences on a variety of factors, including businesses, economies, and international politics. For instance, an increase in the price of oil may stifle economic development, while a precipitous drop in that price can wreak havoc on cash-strapped oil businesses. In the case of nations, a fluctuation in the price of oil may blow a hole in government finances, spur broad economic transformation, or apparently shift geopolitical goals overnight.

Oil price shocks, also known as abrupt fluctuations, have the potential to have a widespread impact on the economy as a whole via a number of different routes. A rise in the price of



oil will have the effect of raising production costs in the private sector, which will, in turn, reduce output. The increased costs will, at the very least, be passed on to customers in the form of higher prices. In addition, since fuel and electricity prices are going up, the cost of living is going up for families, and those who are already struggling financially are especially at risk. These effects may have additional major knock-on effects and consequences across the economy, impacting macro-indicators such as employment, trade balance, inflation, and public accounts, in addition to the prices on the stock market and currency rates. Because of this, the form and amount of such knock-on effects are dependent on the structural features of an economy; for instance, the more a nation participates in the trade of oil, the more it is subject to price shocks on global commodities markets.

Despite the fact that oil exporting countries may view a given oil price increase favorably while oil importing countries may view it unfavorably, an increase in the volatility of oil prices will result in a greater sense of price volatility for all countries, regardless of their overall trade balance. This kind of volatility in the price of oil shortens the time horizons for planning, leads businesses to delay expenditures, and may call for a costly reallocation of resources. When nations that are net importers confront uncertainty over import prices and fuel subsidy levels, and countries that are net exporters experience variable income, it becomes more difficult for such countries to formulate sound national budgets. This may be an especially severe challenge in developing nations that already have limited budgets and that depend heavily on money from oil exports as their

primary source of public funding. In order to protect businesses and households from price fluctuations on global markets, especially in emerging economies, policymakers frequently allot large portions of their budgets to the subsidization of fuel. This is done in order to protect businesses and households from price fluctuations on international markets. These types of subsidy programmes not only put governments at significant financial risk, but they also have a significant negative impact on the environment, primarily benefit those who are already wealthy, discourage the use of energy-efficient practices, and divert resources away from education, healthcare, and other forms of investment in international development.

To summarize, a rise in the price of oil is often accompanied by an increase in the costs and prices of petroleum products. This, in turn, leads to a decline in productivity, which, in turn, results in sluggish economic development. As a consequence, swings in the price of oil have a depressing effect on the expansion of the economy. Because the majority of economic subsectors, such as the transportation, electricity, and industrial subsectors, are highly dependent on oil consumption, a sudden change in the price of oil and a consequent decline in its consumption have a significant impact on the majority of economic subsectors. In addition, it is widely acknowledged that uncertainty is detrimental to the interests of consumers, investors, and the economy as a whole. During times of crisis, the oil market exhibits distinct patterns of behaviour. Recent events, including as the COVID19 pandemic issue and the Russia-Ukraine war, have shown the substantial influence that they have had on oil prices.

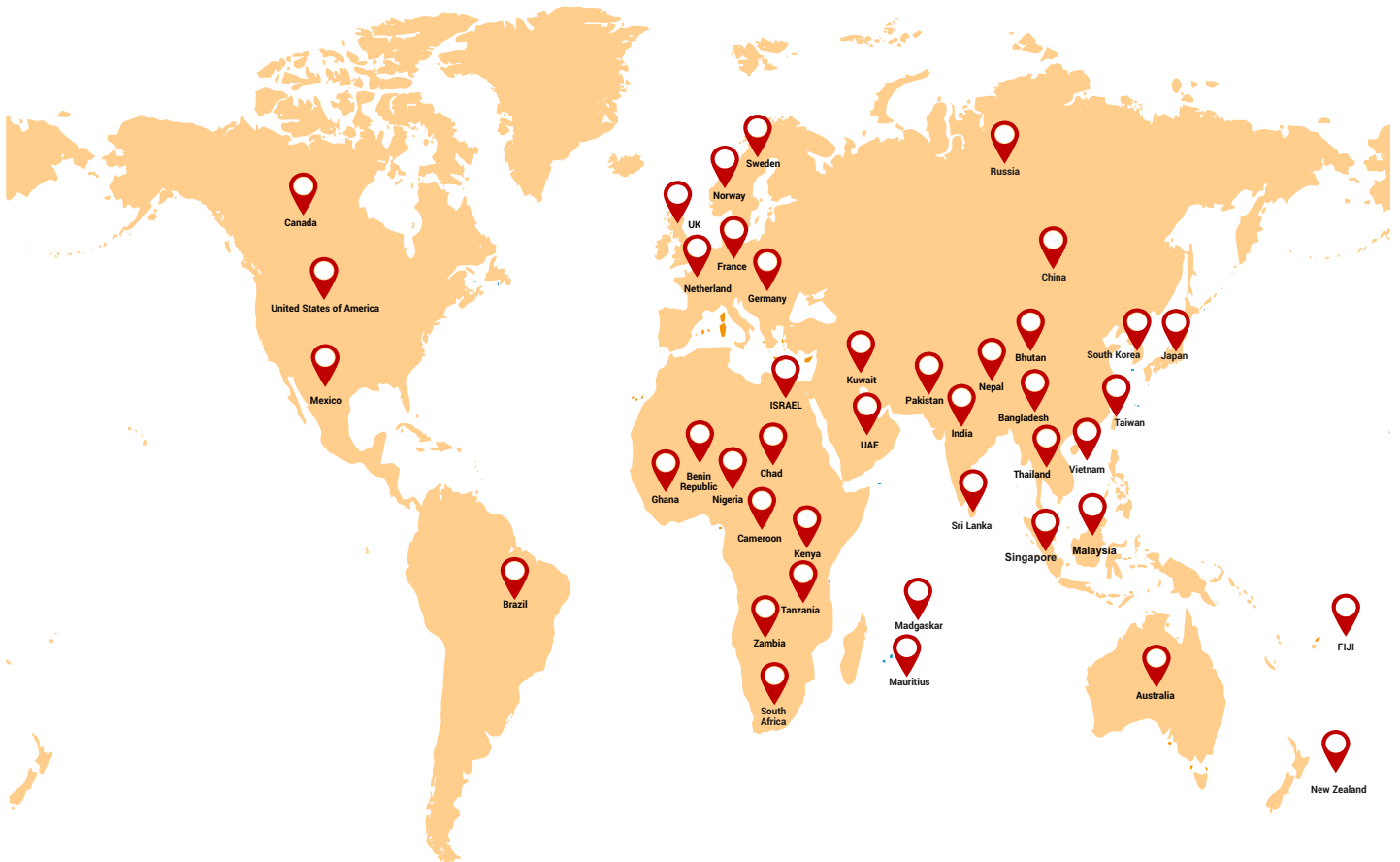

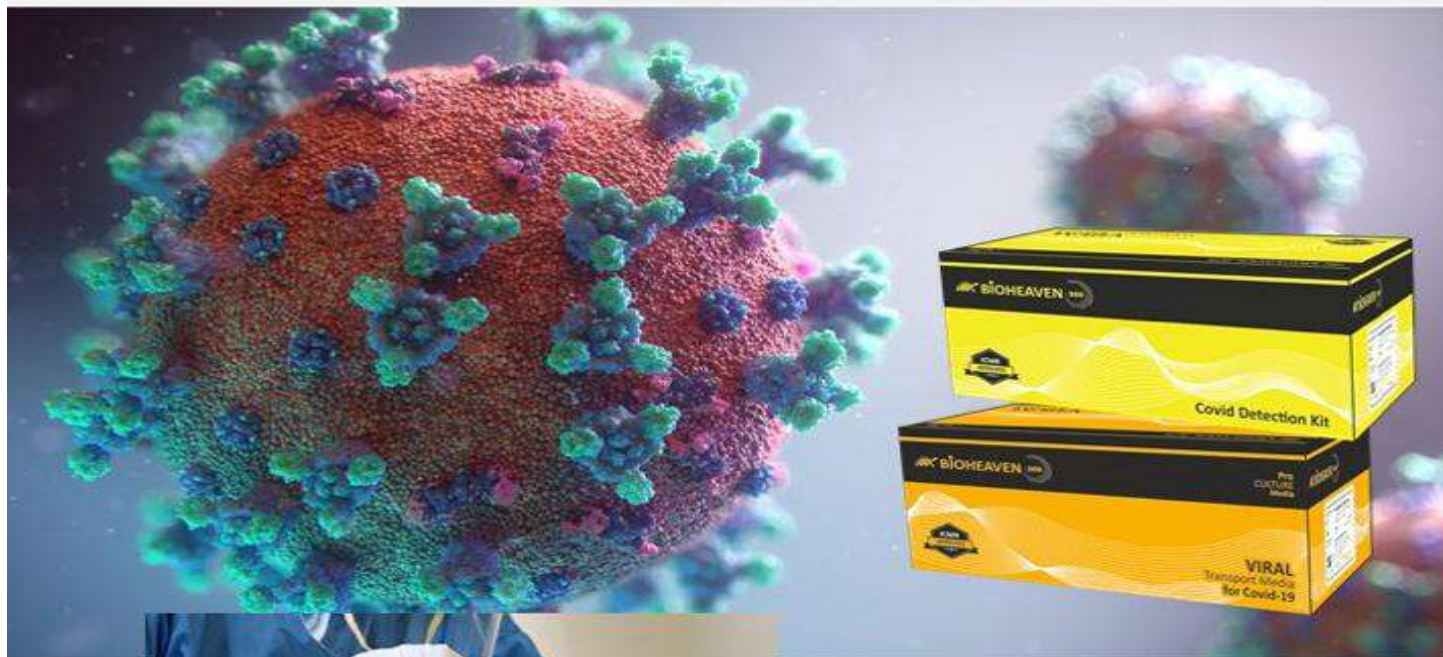
