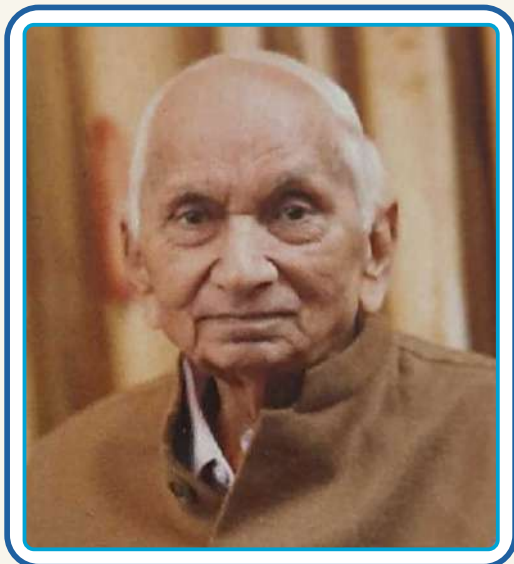

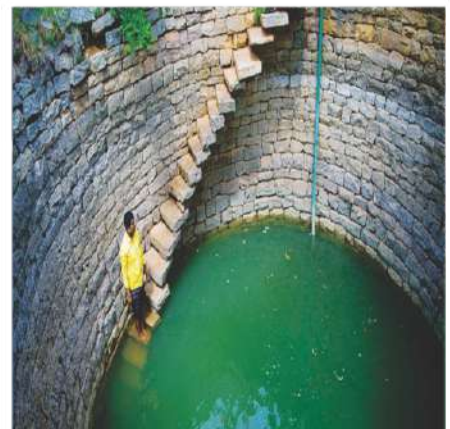

**F**intech firm Payworld expects to double the gross transaction value on its platform to Rs 22,000 crore in a year on account of foray into new segments like data-based credit services, a senior company official said. The company claims to have gross transaction value (GTV) of around Rs 11,000 crore at present.

India's logistics and industrial market continues to attract global funds and investments in the sector in 2022 are expected to surpass last year's investments, according to a Cushman and Wakefield report.

The sector has attracted investments of Rs 8,257 crore since the beginning of this year.



**T**he Sajjan Jindal-led JSW Group is foraying into the lending space with an investment of up to Rs 400 crore in a captive non-bank lender housed in its e-commerce arm, a senior official has said. The non-bank finance company (NBFC) will be a subsidiary of the JSW One Platforms (JSWOP)

and will be doing purchase finance for buyers on the newly started e-commerce arm, Gaurav Sachdeva, the chief executive of JSWOP, told PTI in a recent interaction. Eventually, the NBFC can help out other companies in group like cements, steel or paints by offering financing solutions, Sachdeva, who has worked in the financial services space earlier, said.

Sachdeva said at present, the micro, small and medium enterprises which form JSWOP's clientele are not served by the banking sector as well as they should be, and hence, the USD 22 billion JSW Group felt a need to enter the space.

He said JSWOP will invest around Rs 350-400 crore in the NBFC over the next two years, and the same is a part of an overall USD 4,000 crore capital investment plan outlined for the e-commerce business by FY27.





**M**aruti Suzuki India partnered with Indian Institute of Technology, Bombay to drive innovation programmes for startups on Thursday.

“Our efforts to engage startups aligns with Prime Minister's mantra of 'Sabka Prayas' to make India a global manufacturing hub. Our tie-up with IIT Bombay is an effort in this direction,” Maruti Suzuki India Managing Director & CEO Hisashi Takeuchi said.



**E**-commerce platforms registered a growth of around 25% on an annual basis as they sold goods worth Rs 76,000 crore during the festive season sale in October, market research firm Redseer Strategy Consultants said on Thursday.



**M**odi govt is ready to bring fuel under GST but the states — for whom fuel and liquor are major revenue generators — are unlikely to agree to such a proposal, Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said on Monday.

“For bringing the petrol and diesel under the GST, the states have to agree. If the states make the move, we are ready. We have been ready all along. That's my understanding. It is another issue how to implement it. That question should be addressed to the finance minister,” Petroleum and Natural Gas minister told reporters in Srinagar.

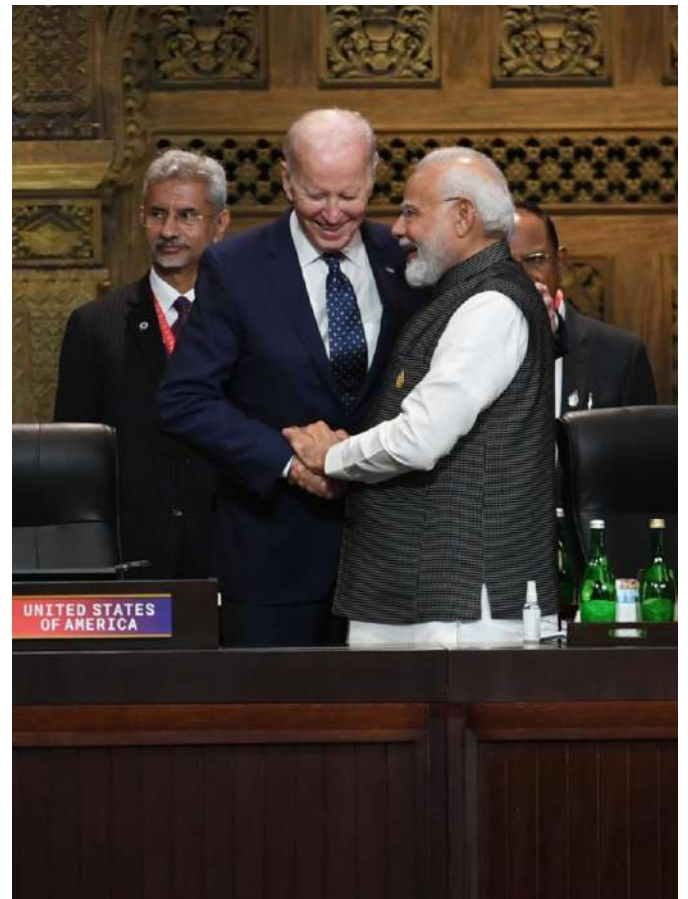

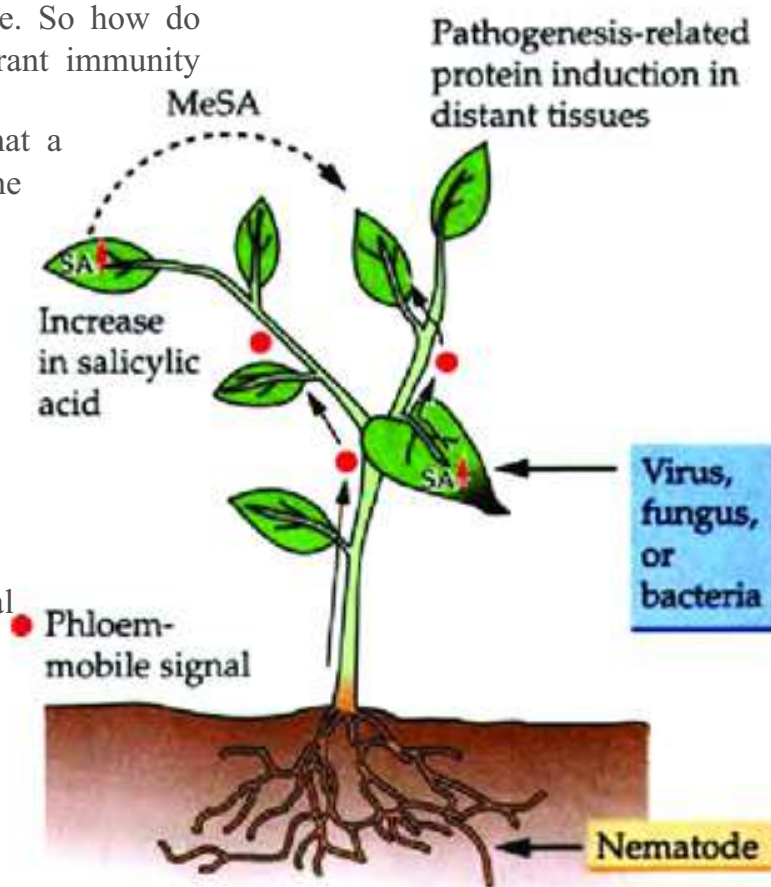
Plants, however, lack specialized immune cells. Instead, every plant cell is thought to be capable of an effective immune response. So how do plants achieve precise, self-tolerant immunity and establish immune memory?

Recent developments suggest that a multilayered plant innate immune system that includes self-monitoring, systemic signaling, and chromosomal alterations together establishes effective immunity. Plants can defend themselves against disease-causing organisms (pathogens) such as viruses, bacteria, and fungi.

They do this by creating physical barriers (e.g. plant cell walls), certain antibiotic compounds (e.g., phytoalexins) and even enzymes that break down pathogens. . In a broad sense, all are part of a plant's immune response, i.e., biological processes that organisms use to fight disease on their own.

# CENTRAL BANK DIGITAL CURRENCY

## A Journey Towards More Transparent, Secure and Efficient Financial System

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is one of the first major central banks in the world to launch a virtual currency pilot programme. The Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) or the Digital rupee (e-rupee) is a central bank-issued digital form of bank notes. According to the RBI, the digital rupee will serve as an alternative to the present forms of currency. It is essentially identical to currency notes, but since it is digital, it is anticipated to be simpler, quicker, and less expensive. Additionally, it has all the transactional advantages of other digital currencies.

Today we are living in the world of financial products powered by innovative technologies like blockchain. Mushrooming of various fintech companies with innovative financial products revolutionized the Banking and Financial services sector in India. India has made remarkable strides in digital payment innovation. Currently, digital payment solutions in India are

economical, accessible, easy, efficient, safe, secure, and available 24X7. The IMPS (Immediate Payment Service), RTGS, and NEFT systems in India enhanced payment convenience. Recent developments in technology-based payment systems and increased public use of these solutions have prompted central banks throughout the world to investigate the possible advantages and hazards of creating a digital currency so as to continue the present trend of innovations.

In a broad sense, CBDC is defined by Reserve Bank as the legal tender issued by a central bank in the form of digital currency. On the other hand, contrary to what many people believe, CBDC is not the same thing as a crypto currency like Bitcoin. The blockchain technology behind crypto currency enables the creation of a decentralized digital asset that may be used as a means of trade. On the other hand, the digital rupee will operate in the same way as a legally acceptable form of money supported by the government. CBDCs are neither commodity, claims on commodities, or digital assets as cryptocurrencies are. Rather, they are simply decentralized digital currency. As is well known, cryptocurrencies do not have a central issuing authority. On the other side, the e-rupee will be a legal currency, which indicates that we will be able to use it to purchase whatever we want. Examples of digital rupees include electronic funds transfers (NEFT) and instant payment



transfer systems (IMPS). Therefore, once the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) begins circulating the digital rupee, all inhabitants of India will be able to utilize it.

The new e-rupee is advantageous in many ways. The RBI's primary motivation for introducing a digital rupee is to advance India in the virtual currency race. In addition, blockchain technology will improve the digital rupee's efficiency and transparency. It provides numerous advantages, including reduced transaction costs, real-time account settlement, rapid cross-border transactions, and no risk of volatility. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) seeks to increase the value of digital payments throughout the nation by launching the digital rupee. Based on the findings of a poll conducted by the RBI, receiving money in the form of cash is still seen as the most convenient way to pay for ongoing costs. Most transactions of little value are conducted exclusively with cash.

On November 1, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) began a pilot experiment on central bank digital money (CBDC). The name of the platform is NDS-OM CBDC. It was a pivotal milestone in the history of India's currency. This pilot programme will be used to settle transactions on the secondary market for government securities. Participating in the pilot are the State Bank of India, Bank of Baroda, Union Bank of India, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Yes Bank, IDFC First Bank, and HSBC. According to the RBI, digital Rupee for the Retail Segment would also be introduced in the near future.

In a nutshell, the launch of a digital currency marks an important milestone in India's progression toward becoming a fully digital

nation. Since many years, our nation is struggling with the difficulty of currency placement and monitoring of the same. CBDC has the capacity to deal with the issue of anonymity, settle it in a manner that does not involve intimidation, and lower the need for cash payments. The savings made by the government in areas such as operations, printing, distribution, and storage will help the government realize its goal of moving toward a cashless economy

## Various Causes of Hyperactivity in Youngsters

(Jyoti Jain - Author, Educator, Cognitive Behavioral Counsellor, Addiction and Relationship Counsellor, International Vedic Math Expert) While some kids can happily spend an entire day coloring or playing quietly with blocks, others can't seem to stay still for more than two minutes. Most of the time, they climb walls while fidgeting, jumping, and bouncing. The diagnosis of attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) may be made quickly for a lively child. However, hyperactivity in children is not limited to that.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, approximately 9% of children have the condition. ADHD is a neurobiological condition characterized by impulsivity, difficulty concentrating, and increased activity. According to the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM), hyperactivity-related symptoms of ADHD include:

- Difficulty sitting still; continually squirming and moving feet and hands, or standing up and moving when others are

seated.

- They are running or climbing at inappropriate times.
- They rarely taking part in play activities quietly.
- Talking constantly can cause problems at school and in social settings.
- Difficulty taking turns.
- They are interrupting other people.

Talk to your pediatrician if you think your child may have ADHD. Standing up and moving when others are seated or squirming and moving their feet and hands constantly although there is no specific test for the condition, a pediatrician can assess your child and, if necessary, refer them for additional evaluation. There is a treatment for ADHD, which may or may not include medication, if it gets diagnosed.

Causes of hyperactivity not related to ADHD. Not every wriggly, busy child has ADHD. Once in a while, different reasons underlie a kid's high activity level.

Children often become hyperactive when they are going through a stressful life event, whether it's permanent chaos or a short-term schedule change. A child can experience a lot of stress even when they experience positive changes, like having a new baby or moving to a better neighborhood.

Keep in mind that children pick up on their parents' stress before you decide that your child cannot possibly be impacted by relationship or financial issues. If you're worried, there's a decent opportunity for your kid is worried as well. Ensure that your child follows a predictable routine. Assuming that you're encountering



unpleasant life-altering situations, give your youngster additional consolation and backing.

Problems with one's mental or emotional health In children, emotional issues frequently resemble behavioral disorders. It may be difficult for a child with an anxiety disorder to remain still. Alternately, a person who has been traumatized by a frightening event may be unable to concentrate.

You should seek professional assistance if you think your child's hyperactivity is caused by an emotional problem. A wide range of symptoms, including hyperactivity, can be reduced through treatment. Some physical health issues can lead to hyperactivity. An overactive thyroid, for instance, can result in a variety of symptoms, including hyperactivity and anxiety. There are additionally genetic problems that could cause more activity.

Talk about your child's symptoms with your pediatrician. A doctor may be able to identify potential health issues that may be the root of the issue if you keep a detailed list of your concerns.

Lack of Physical Activity; children ought to be energetic and active. They won't be able to stay still if they don't get enough exercise. Sadly, some hyperactive children are punished at school by losing access to recess. Hyperactivity gets worse when kids don't have the chance to play and run around.

Encourage your child to exercise frequently each day. Playing on a jungle gym, riding a bicycle,

and running offer your youngster a chance to channel their energy into useful exercises. Children often become hyperactive when they don't get enough sleep, whereas adults tend to become sluggish when they are tired. A sleepy child may appear more animated than ever due to a missed nap or early bedtime.

A child's body produces more cortisol and adrenaline to keep them awake when they don't get enough sleep. They will therefore have more energy. Ensure that your child gets enough sleep. Talk to your pediatrician about possible solutions if you struggle to ensure that they get enough sleep.

Although young children typically have a lot of energy, hyperactivity can cause problems in their lives. For instance, children must be able to remain still for an extended period to learn. However, it is essential to set reasonable standards for your child. While you work from home, thinking that your preschooler should play quietly in their room could make you think that your child is hyperactive when in fact their behavior is developmentally appropriate.

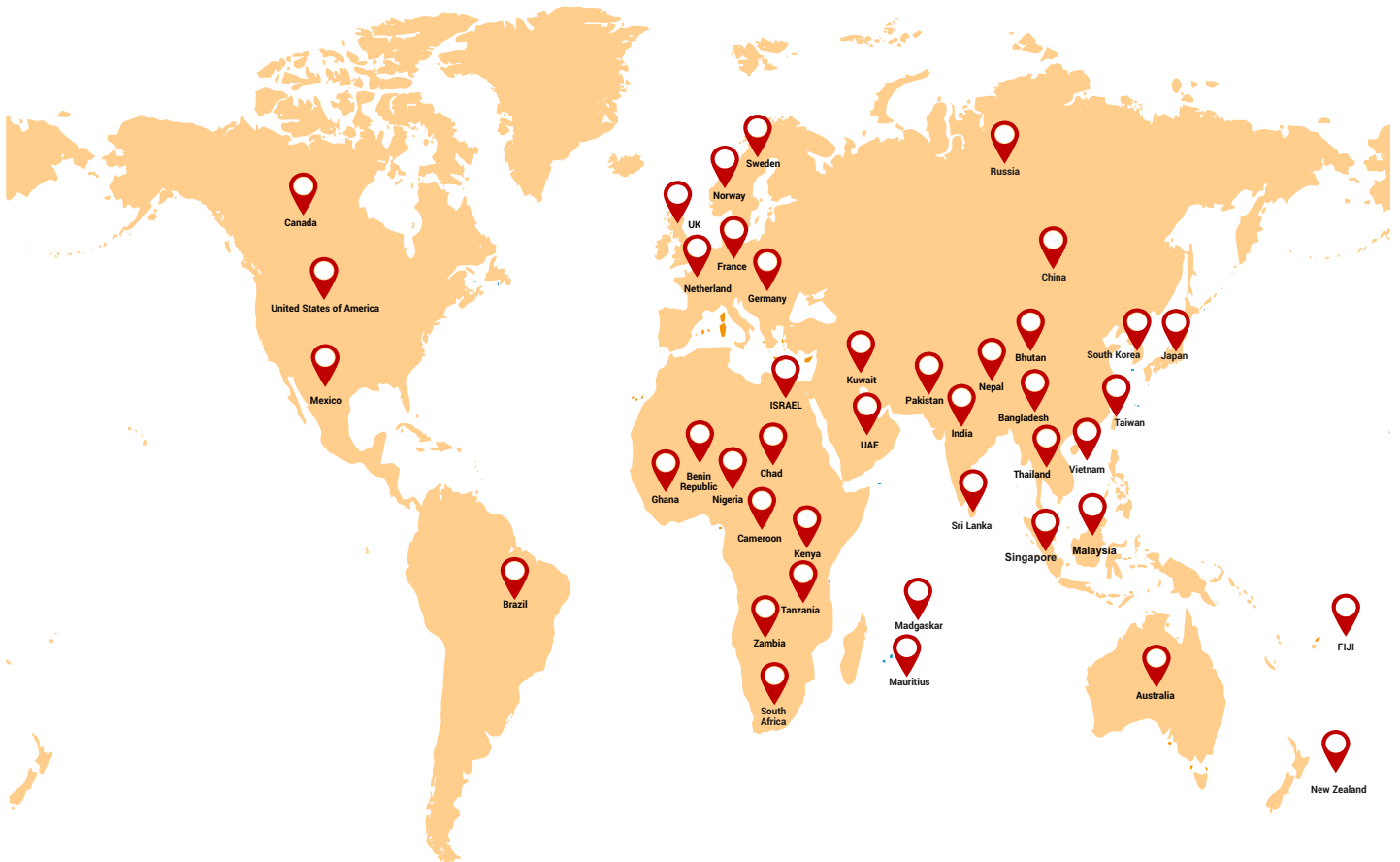

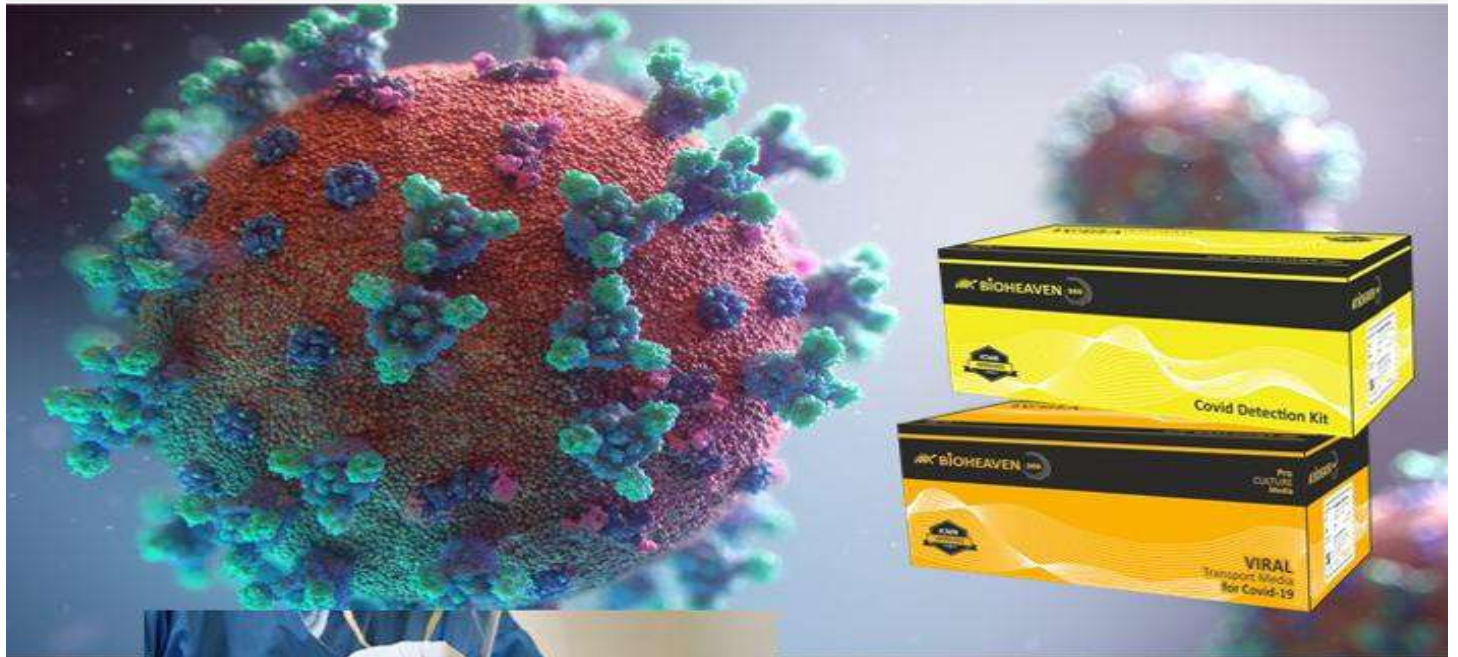
