# Strategies to Motivate Students

eachers earn degrees and teaching certifications by dedicating years of effort and thousands of dollars to becoming subject matter experts. Curriculum maps and teaching calendars are created to ensure that the appropriate standards are covered. In order to fully comprehend all of the most recent educational pedagogy, we participate in countless hours of professional development. We collaborate with colleagues to implement classroom best practices for all of us. In order to monitor students' progress, we create assessments. We use deliberate interventions to help students get back on track when all of this fails.

Students continue to fail.

The issue is that a lot of students lack motivation to learn. An unmotivated student will not learn, regardless of the perfect lesson plan. Some educators assert that their job is not to inspire students. A teacher's responsibility is to effectively teach the material; The student must find their own motivation and take responsibility for their learning. Many teachers are restricted to being average by this outdated idea. A great teacher knows that students need to be motivated to learn in order to succeed, and teachers are in the best position to do so. Students can be motivated in the classroom by employing the following methods:

### 1. Prefer growth over fixed thinking?

Carol Dweck argues in her book Mindset that students have a fundamental belief about learning: a growth mindset or a fixed mindset. A fixed mindset holds that abilities cannot be changed and that people are born with or without certain talents and abilities. Learners with a fixed mindset want to prove themselves, so they often avoid challenges because they don't want to look like they're struggling. On the other hand, a learner with a growth mindset holds the belief that one can cultivate and improve one's skills and abilities through hard work. Students with a growth mindset enjoy challenges and view challenges and failures as necessary for growth. There is no doubt that learners with a growth mindset are more motivated to work hard.

In the classroom, how can we foster a growth mindset?

Providing praise for our students' efforts and dedication is one of the most effective forms of feedback. The statements "I can tell that you have been practicing your reading" or "The practice is paying off on your times tables" demonstrate to students that they are in control of their academic success. However, we cannot continue to praise ability: "Wow, you are such a brilliant math student" or "You are such an amazing reader." The fixed mindset that students either have the ability or they don't and that no amount of hard work on their part can change the outcome is reinforced when abilities are praised over efforts. We should be encouraged because we are all learners.

Formative and summative assessments are used by teachers to gauge a student's progress over the course of a learning cycle. The goal of formative assessment is to find out what students need to know to do well on a later summative test. The purpose of formative assessment is to provide teachers and students with information about areas in which they can make advancements, both individually and as a class, so that both can take appropriate action to boost their performance on the final assessment. Formative assessments include: a test of comprehension with a "thumbs up" or "down" button, a quiz for small groups, or an exit slip at the end of a lesson. In order for students to advance in their learning, it is essential that they receive prompt and detailed feedback from the assessment. The outcome of a subsequent summative assessment will be improved by this learning cycle.

We can demonstrate the growth mindset as educators. Have faith! Be open to making necessary adjustments and solicit feedback from students about your teaching. Keep at it! Put in a lot of effort for the students and show them how hard work and dedication lead to growth and success. This feedback demonstrates that we are learners as well. Additionally, it invites our students to join us on the learning journey. Students are always willing to put in a lot of effort in return for a teacher who rewards that effort.

2. Create relationships with your students that are meaningful and respectful.

We need to get to know each and every one of our students personally if we are going to truly inspire and motivate them all. We need to know about their hobbies and interests, their friends, their family, and what excites them. We need to be aware of the motivational needs of each student in order to determine which strategies might be effective.

Give students five minutes to share "Good News" to get them started on that "knowing." Student A, for instance,



declares, "I am a new uncle! This past weekend, my sister gave birth to a son! This is an opportunity for us to learn about our students as individuals and demonstrate our individual concern for them. Teachers can also use this to talk about their personal lives outside of the classroom. Students are more likely to share and become vulnerable with teachers who are willing to do so personally. Students are more likely to take risks and ask the questions they need to ask in order to succeed when they see one another as whole people.

### **Strategies to Motivate Students**

There are several types of students in each classroom: verbal, tactile, and more reserved than others. We can see it as our duty to learn this from our knowledge of them and to teach them accordingly. As a result of this work, we are better able to get to know our students, which makes our learning community more open and cohesive.

### 3. Create a learning community in your classroom.

The classroom must be a safe place where students are willing to struggle and take risks. Students and teachers must collaborate toward common objectives in order to achieve this objective. In class, students must be willing to collaborate with and help other students. As part of learning, struggle should be accepted and encouraged.

Teachers give lectures, students take notes, and then the students independently check their understanding by doing their own work. True community is created when this outof-date model is updated to include more time for students to converse with one another. The activity that should take place between the teacher's lecture and the independent work should be collaborative group work. During this time, students can collectively process information and ask questions. With new concepts, students engage in what could be referred to as the "problem-solving" phase of their development, leading to new knowledge. By gradually transferring responsibility from teacher to student, students become engaged in their own learning rather than passive observers of what the instructor teaches.

The work of the students ought to be proudly displayed throughout the classroom. This shows students that they are actively contributing to the classroom's knowledge creation. The teacher is not the only person who knows everything. Additionally, teachers have the option of employing language that emphasizes the community of learners, which includes the instructor, as opposed to a room full of individual students. It is significant to use "we" and "our" instead of "I" and "you," to facilitate interdependent learning in the classroom.

### 4. Set precise objectives and high expectations.

Students are able to rise to the occasion when they are

supported in their struggles and high expectations are set. Students are motivated to reach their goals when expectations are clear and they know where their learning is going: The path can be seen. Students gain a sense of purpose and meaning for their labour by working toward daily, weekly, and yearly objectives.

On a daily basis, daily learning goals (also known as learning targets or "I can" statements) should be posted, visible, and referenced. Students are given a reason to learn when the "goal of the day" is established at the beginning of the lesson.

At the conclusion of each lesson, students can also formatively evaluate themselves by verifying that they have accomplished the learning objectives.

High academic expectations are synonymous with learning, but deep learning necessitates high standards for behaviour, academic language, group work, and even the length and format of individual work. We cannot assume that students are familiar with these requirements. They must be outlined in detail. We must instruct students on how to interact with one another and hold them accountable if we want them to do so. Modelling and anticipating a certain format for an assignment is necessary. Learning takes precedence in the classroom once the routines that support expectations are established and made clear to the learning community.

### 5. Be motivating.

The majority of adults can recall a specific childhood teacher who had a lasting impact. These are the teachers whose students have been enthralled, challenged, and motivated to such an extent that they will always be remembered.

What is it about these teachers that inspires?

Students see success in teachers who inspire them. Success for teachers might be: winning a teaching award, owning a small business, or finishing a 10K race. We all have accomplishments to share. Students can gain an understanding of what success is and how to pursue it through our victories. When our students make the decision that they want to succeed, they pay close attention to the actions, choices, and even the sacrifices that made us successful. Hard work, a willingness to struggle, and the capacity to learn from our mistakes are examples of these behaviours. Students internalize our methods and behaviours as a means of achieving their own objectives. In the course of our daily activities, assignments, and interactions with them, we provide them with this opportunity.

he valley of Kashmir is home to snowladen mountains and attracts thousands of tourists annually with its exquisite handicrafts. The Kashmiri Carpets and Shawls are famous worldwide for their handwoven beauty. The real heroes behind the beautiful handicrafts of the valley are its gifted artisans who have been doing this for ages and are responsible for making the valley's art famous and for carrying the thousand years old legacy forward for the younger generations to learn from.

One of these unspoken heroes is Mr. Yaqoob Bafanda. Born and brought up in a humble family in the valley, Mr. Bafanda describes how he believes destiny is nothing but how much effort a man puts into his work to achieve his goals.

"With the right number of hours put into your work, good intentions in heart, and god's blessings one can achieve anything they wish to."

When you scroll through his Instagram you would find various pictures of beautifully woven Kashmiri shawls that would make you stay on his Instagram page a little longer than you had intended to. Beautiful art crafts made out of paper mache and cotton suits of Ari embroidery are to look for. Bafanda tells that every piece of work requires precision and practice to maintain the quality of work.

He told that his family has been involved in the business of handmade carpets and shawls even before he was born. He describes how his father used to wake up at the brink of dawn and work till late at night. His father has been his source of inspiration all his life. Watching him work relentlessly to provide the family with everything inspired Mr. Yaqoob to work honestly and never give up despite how challenging the circumstances to get.

In 2020 when the world suddenly came to a halt due to the deadly coronavirus many businesses were uprooted and artists had to sleep on an empty stomach. At times when people were only buying the necessities, it was a far fetch dream for them to buy expensive carpets and shawls. Artisans, Businessmen, and laborers around the world suffered the wrath of COVID-19 through stocked-up warehouses and zero to null sales. The valley too suffered the rage of the pandemic



and made several businesses shut down which are still finding it hard to surface back in the market.

Yaqoob's business was also affected by the pandemic and he had to spend several months in his home uncertain of what the future may behold for him. This is when his well-wisher Ms. Praveen Shalini Dhawan approached him to venture into the business of dry fruits. Yaqoob who was already going through a lot was uncertain and concerned about starting a new business at times when it was hard for even ageold businesses to survive. But when his friend showed faith in him, he surrendered himself to god and leaped into the business of dry fruits. The business did well enough to get him through the lockdown.

Most people hire digital marketing experts to expand their business on social media but Yaqoob did it all by himself without anyone's help. # Green Hydrogen Mission: A critical step towards India's robust energy security

he Union Cabinet of India, chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has given its approval to the National Green Hydrogen Mission. The National Green Hydrogen Mission has the goals of making India a global hub for the production, utilization, and export of green hydrogen and its derivatives; assisting India in becoming energy independent; and decarbonizing major parts of the country's economy. The government has announced Rs. 19744 crores for this prestigious mission. In this light, it is of the utmost importance to have an understanding of the meaning, ways of production, present level of development, benefits, and obstacles associated with the generation of green hydrogen on a worldwide scale. The present article discusses each of these facets in further depth.

### What is Green Hydrogen?

In the periodic table, hydrogen has the position of being both the simplest and the smallest element. It is the most common element in the universe; however, it is not found in the pure form in the nature. It is necessary for it to mix with other compounds in order to become stable due to the fact that it is a volatile substance. For example, when it interacts with oxygen, it causes the formation of water. The result is always the same kind of carbon-free molecule,

regardless of the manufacturing process. However, there are many different routes that may be taken to manufacture it, and the emissions of greenhouse gases such as carbon dioxide (CO2) and methane (CH4) also vary greatly. Based on the method of the production, the hydrogen types are categorized as grey, blue and green Hydrogen. According to the World Economic Forum, Green hydrogen is defined as "the hydrogen produced by splitting water into hydrogen and oxygen using renewable electricity". Methane (CH4) is historically converted into carbon dioxide (the primary contributor to climate change) and hydrogen (H2) by the use of steam in the conventional method of producing grey hydrogen. In recent years, grey hydrogen has also been created from coal, which results in much greater CO2 emissions for each unit of hydrogen that is produced. Blue hydrogen is created when natural gas is divided into hydrogen and carbon dioxide using either "Steam Methane Reforming (SMR)" or "Auto Thermal Reforming (ATR)", but the CO2 is caught and stored. As greenhouse gas emissions are collected, the planet's environmental repercussions are mitigated. Compared to grey hydrogen, the creation of blue hydrogen is less hazardous to the environment.

Coming to the green hydrogen, it is produced by produced by splitting water by electrolysis. We can utilize the hydrogen and release the oxygen into the atmosphere without harm. We need energy and power to do electrolysis. This green hydrogen production method is fueled by green energy sources such as wind or solar. As a result, green hydrogen is



the cleanest choice - hydrogen derived from sources of renewable electricity with no CO2 emissions as a byproduct.

### **Benefits of Green Hydrogen**

One of the future targets stated by governments throughout the globe is to decarbonize the earth. India has said that it intends to achieve net zero emissions by 2070. One way to achieving this is decarbonizing the manufacturing of an element like hydrogen, resulting in green hydrogen. According to the International Energy Agency, this way of creating green hydrogen would avoid the 830 million tonnes of CO2 generated yearly. In addition, green hydrogen is also quite adaptable, since it may be converted into a synthetic gas or energy. It has commercial, household, mobility, and industrial applications. Because hydrogen is so light, it is also incredibly easy to store. Hydrogen fuel cell technology generates a high-density, energy-efficient energy source. Its fuel efficiency allows it to produce more energy per pound of fuel than other energy sources.

### Challenges and the way forward

It is important to note that even though there are many benefits associated with green hydrogen generation, the costs associated with it right now are rather significant. This is as a result of the fact that the generation of energy from renewable sources, which is essential for the production of green hydrogen via electrolysis, costs more money, which in turn makes hydrogen more costly to acquire. Furthermore, the manufacturing of hydrogen, in general, and green hydrogen, in particular, takes a greater amount of energy than the production of other fuels. There are certain safety concerns, as well, which have been brought up by a few different authorities. Because hydrogen is such a highly reactive and combustible element, stringent safety precautions are essential in order to forestall the risk of explosions and leaks

occurring.

Several studies suggest that by the year 2050, India's need for hydrogen might have increased by more than a factor of four, accounting for approximately 10% of total world consumption. The national green hydrogen mission is an important step toward addressing India's future energy needs while also contributing to the country's efforts to combat climate change and achieve other socioeconomic goals. This mission comes at the perfect moment. By the year 2030, the strategy intends to accomplish the goal of meeting the production objectives of 5 million tonnes of green hydrogen per year and the accompanying renewable capacity increases. But if India wants to deploy hydrogen on a large scale, it needs a combination of the two forms of hydrogen (Green and Blue), along with technical maturity and the ability to compete with other ways that are already in use.

### **OBITUARIES**



Sharad Yadav died on Thursday, January 12 at the age of 75. His daughter, Subhashini Sharad Yadav, confirmed the news on Twitter saying, "Papa nahi rahe (Papa is no more)."The former minister's health had been deteriorating and he was admitted to Gurugram's Fortis hospital. The hospital issued a statement saying Sharad Yadav was brought to the emergency ward in an "unconscious and unresponsive state" and he did not have "any pulse or recordable blood pressure".

He honed his acting skills in local theatre before making it to the silver screen. The journey wasn't an easy one, though. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's mother Heeraben Modi has been cremated after she died in the early hours of the morning.

She was 99 years old, and had been in hospital in western Gujarat state - where she lived - since Wednesday after her health deteriorated.

"A glorious century rests at the feet of God," Mr Modi tweeted on Friday morning.

He reached Gujarat in the morning and lit his mother's funeral pyre.

After the funeral, he attended events that had been scheduled in West Bengal state through video conferencing.

The Indian prime minister often visited his mother to seek her blessings on important occasions and festivals.

Her life and sacrifices had "shaped" his mind, personality and self-confidence, Mr Modi wrote in his blog on 18 June when Heeraben turned 99.

"My Mother is as simple as she is extraordinary. Just like all mothers," he wrote.
